2022 Gordon's Grads Contest Official Rules

Description of the Contest: Gordon McKernan Injury Attorneys and its charity arm, Gordon Gives, are hosting a giveaway contest for graduating seniors across the state of Louisiana. The contest will give graduating high school seniors the chance to win a free laptop computer for college or trade school.

Eligibility: The contest is open to all high graduating school seniors across the state of Louisiana who are graduating during the Spring of 2022 and attending a college or trade school during the Fall of 2022. All applicants must provide proof of enrollment into a college or trade school upon registration. All eligible applicants will be considered without regard to race, sex, religion, or national origin. The following individuals are not eligible to enter: (a) employees of Gordon McKernan; (b) immediate family members of employees of GMIA; (c) those living in the same household as employees of GMIA; and (d) those who entered in any previous Gordon's Grads contests.

How to Enter: All contestants must complete the registration form and requirements on www.gordonsgrads.com by Friday, May 13th at 11:59 p.m. CST. Contestants will be asked to submit a 300+ word essay or a 1+ minute long video answering the following: *Tell us why you deserve to win a laptop for school and what qualities and values you have that set you apart from others.*

Prize: Twelve (12) contestants across the state of Louisiana will win one (1) Microsoft Surface Laptop Go. ANY PARTICIPANT WHO IS NOTIFIED THAT HE OR SHE HAS WON IS A POTENTIAL WINNER UNTIL scholarship committee DETERMINES, IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION, THAT THE PARTICIPANT IS ELIGIBLE TO WIN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THESE OFFICIAL RULES. Prize may not be redeemed as cash (or any other tender) or substituted for another prize of equal or lesser value. The Prizes are non-transferable.

Rules and Regulations: Entries must include proof of Fall 2022 enrollment into a college, university or trade school and an essay and/or video. Applicants must contest authentic work and may only enter as an individual and not as a group effort. Only one applicant per contestant is allowed.

Selection Process: All applications will be considered by an impartial scholarship committee assembled by Gordon McKernan. Gordon McKernan Injury Attorneys is committed to creating a diverse and inclusive environment. All submissions will

be judged fairly and equally, regardless of race, gender, sexuality, religion, disability, or other protected categories. Failure to provide the requested information may disqualify your application. Please note, the Scholarship Committee's decision is final. No appeals will be permitted. The scholarship committee is not responsible for problems with the web page, application form, or any other technical problem that prevents timely submission of an application.
